

**LIST OF DOCUMENTS**  
**FOR MEDICAL TREATMENT VISA**

*You wish to travel to Italy in order to receive **medical treatment** from a previously selected accredited Italian public or private healthcare institution.*

- Original short-stay visa application form, completed and signed**  
*Download the form (short stay / long stay), although it will also be provided upon arrival at the VFS Global center.*
- Biometric photograph**  
*Recent color ID photo (width 35 mm, height 40 mm) taken within the last 6 months, on a white background with uncovered face, compliant with [ICAO](#) standards.*
- Original passport**  
*With a validity exceeding at least 3 months for a short stay and 15 months for a long stay beyond the date on which the applicant intends to leave the territory of the Member States or, in the case of multiple journeys, the date of the last departure from the territory of the Member States, and containing at least two blank pages facing each other for affixing the visa.*
- Photocopy of the passport**  
*Photocopy of the biometric data page and all pages containing visas as well as entry and exit stamps from the Schengen area, including a photocopy of the previous passport if the current passport was issued less than one year ago.*
- Reservation**
- Invitation letter from an Italian organization or a private resident in Italy, indicating any assumption of medical treatment, travel, and accommodation expenses**
  - *Documentation from the Algerian doctor or hospital specifying the diagnosis and the reasons justifying the need for treatment in Italy (accompanied by a translation into Italian).*
  - *Declaration from the selected Italian healthcare institution, public or accredited private, indicating the type of treatment, the treatment start date and estimated duration, any hospitalization, and its cost.*
  - *Declaration from the Italian hospital certifying payment of the deposit (30% of the total costs) to the selected institution, based on the estimated costs of the required services, or a specific administrative act issued by an Italian region or a specific authorization from the Ministry of Health sponsoring a humanitarian aid program.*
- Documentation proving the availability of sufficient financial resources in Italy**  
*For payment of the remaining treatment costs, food, accommodation, and possible repatriation of the applicant and any accompanying person.*
- Travel medical insurance (photocopy) with minimum coverage of €30,000**  
*It must cover medical and hospital expenses during the stay in Italy, including social assistance resulting from treatment that may be required during the first stay in Italy and/or the Schengen area, as well as any repatriation costs. It must be valid (as area of coverage) for Italy, the Schengen area, or Europe.*
